From the Deacons' Bench

We tend to think of the family and the cozy tight-knit community as being firmly in God's territory. And insofar as we are bound together by love, it is. But God's territory extends beyond that as well. The Bible is replete with stories of wanderers, outsiders, and people in exile; total strangers to the community they find themselves in or else people who've been away so long that they now feel like strangers returning to the place they once called home.

I think of the tribulations faced by Jacob and later Moses roaming through harsh foreign lands, the treacherous missionary voyages of the apostle Paul, the parables of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son, and of course Jesus himself: Born in the manger of an overcrowded inn in the strange city of Bethlehem, whisked away to refuge in Egypt by his parents, and finally returning to the family's home town of Nazareth. Where compassion can be found for people who aren't sure if they've quite found their place, that is God's territory too.

When I first came back to the US after several years of living in Canada and began discussing spirituality with Pastor Pat in spite of my long-held lukewarm distrust in Christianity, I felt like a kind of exile. Now I know a good chunk of the congregation and consider the church family one of the core elements of my life. I feel welcome and integrated, and grateful for the help I've received to do my best at walking in faith.

But rather than getting too comfortable in my own little corner of the community, I prefer seeing our congregation keep the door open for even more exiles: People who've been out of the habit of visiting for a long time, people who are new to the area or new to church, people who are unsure of their denomination or even their religion, and people who don't know if they fit in and are afraid of being a burden.

When Pastor Kwan joined us, moving up from North Carolina and having to leave precious members of his family behind for a year, his arrival was warmly met by our congregation and his personal sacrifices deeply appreciated. We've all been glad to be able to

spend some time with his son Tom this month as he visits us, as I'm sure we will also be when his wife Sue arrives and his son Teak Kim comes to visit with her. I'm confident our congregation is up to the challenge of making them feel at home in a relatively new place.

Under Pastor Kwan's guidance, I've seen our church work to grow in our spirit of welcoming, because we want everyone to feel free to worship with us, eat with us and not worry about being left out, share their personal stories and ideas, study with us even if (or especially if) they have a thousand questions, and dabble in volunteering for any of the church's teams, committees, and projects they have a passion for when and how they are able to.


