From the Pastor's Desk

We are entering the season of Lent, which lasts 40 days (excluding Sundays) and is during which Christians prepare for Easter. This year, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (March 5th) and ends on Holy Saturday (April 19th), the day before Easter Sunday (April 20th). The number 40 symbolizes the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness, as described in the New Testament.

For this reason, during Lent, Christians often give up certain foods or habits to focus on spiritual growth, self-discipline, and reflection. It's also a time for charity, prayer, and helping believers connect more deeply with their faith and others in need. It is a time to be reminded of our sinfulness and God's everlasting love.

God gave us his only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. He chose to let him die on the cross to give us life. He chose him to be beaten and broken to make us whole. And God's work of salvation had been concluded on Easter Sunday with his resurrection, giving us hope for eternal life. How can we describe the depth, length, width, and height of God's love toward us?

So, I recommend a couple of things to make this season meaningful. First, let's have an intentional quiet time to ponder our weaknesses and God's mercy. Reading scripture or devotionals and praying for the beloved and those in need would also help you develop a deep relationship with God.

Second, let's give ourselves to the Lord by volunteering in various ministries or charity works. Lent is a time to remember that Jesus gave himself up for us. Therefore, it is also right for us to give ourselves to others. Calling or texting those who are sick and delivering food to those in need would be a good start.

Lastly, let's worship the Lord with our whole heart. What would our Father want us to do most during this season? It is to be with Him with a loving heart. As a father, I want to spend more time with my children. I hope they think of me sometimes. I am glad when they love to be with me. God's heart is the same. That's why He named His only Son Jesus "Immanuel: God with US." Come to worship and give your love to your Heavenly Father.

Lent begins this Wednesday (March 5th). Let this season guide you to a deeper relationship with God. Let your service reflect Christ's self-giving love. Let your worship overwhelm God's joy.

Missions Committee Update

Requesting Home Essentials to be Donated

Throughout March, we are collecting home essentials to be distributed to those in need by the Springfield Rescue Mission.

We are requesting cutlery, pots and pans, bowls and plates, mugs and glasses, can openers, kettles, soap dispensers, toothbrush holders, towels, and anything else you can think of which would be useful to someone starting from zero in a new home. Donations may be dropped off on the donation table in Libby Hall. Items may be new or used as long as they're in decent condition. For safety reasons, please do not donate sharp knives. Butter knives are acceptable. Due to space constraints, please do not donate microwaves or any large appliances.

As part of their program, the Springfield Rescue Mission supplies people in need with basic home necessities. Many of these people have recently been homeless and in rehab, and will be moving into a home of their own for the first time in a long time. Many are also refugees or immigrants from a poor background trying to land on their feet as they start their lives in the US with almost no material possessions.

We thank you for your support of this mission to help people going through difficult transitions in their lives get the aid they need and know that they matter to us as beloved children of God.



Christian Education

As we enter the season of Lent and prepare for the celebration of Easter, it's a perfect time to reflect on the rich meaning of the **acolyte**. Often, we see acolytes lighting the candles at the beginning of the service and extinguishing them at the end, but the deeper significance of these actions invites us to consider how we are called to carry the **Light of Christ** with us into the world.

Lighting the Candles: Welcoming the Light of Christ

In Christian symbolism, light represents **Christ as the "Light of the World"** (John 8:12). The acolyte, by lighting the candles, symbolizes Christ's presence in the service. Just as light dispels darkness, Christ brings light into our lives, guiding us through the journey of faith.

As the acolyte walks forward with the candle lighter, it's a visual reminder for us to prepare our hearts for worship and to acknowledge Christ's presence among us. The light represents spiritual illumination that Christ brings to our lives—revealing truth, hope, and salvation.

Extinguishing the Candles: Carrying Christ's Light into the World

At the end of the service, the acolyte extinguishes the candles, symbolizing the conclusion of our time of worship. But here is the key detail: **one candle is left burning** as the acolyte exits the sanctuary with the pastor right behind. The remaining light reflects our calling as Christians. We are to take that light with us, sharing it with the world through our actions, words, and love. **Christ's light continues to shine in the world through us**.

The Acolyte: A Symbol of Service and Discipleship

As young people serve as acolytes, they learn the importance of reverence, responsibility, and being an active part of the worshiping community. They take on the responsibility of assisting

with the sacred rituals of the service and, in doing so, deepen their understanding of the significance of Christ's light in their lives.

Conclusion: Taking the Light of Christ into the World

This March, let us remember that we are bearers of the Light of Christ. May we be inspired by the acolyte's role to serve with humility, reflect on Christ's presence in our lives, and shine His light to others, bringing hope and love to a world in desperate need of Christ's love and light.
