From the Pastor's Desk

Invitation to the upcoming meaningful services

As April arrives, Easter is just around the corner. Trees and flowers that looked dead during the winter are revived with green leaves and charming flowers, making the world beautiful. This reminds us of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Easter is the day when Jesus overcame death. It is the day when all believers received hope for eternal life. Jesus, the Son of God, died for sinners like you and me. Jesus' ministry, his teaching, and his equipping of disciples point out the cross. All his ministries were to prepare his people for the cross and resurrection. Therefore, Easter should be when we give our greatest thanksgiving and love to our Heavenly Father, who gave His only son to us as a sacrifice for all, and to Jesus, who was nailed and died on the cross to cleanse our sins.

Jesus didn't stay there in death. He is risen. Because Jesus resurrected from the dead, we will also live. Death cannot defeat us anymore. Because he lives, we can face tomorrow. Because he lives, his light shines upon our darkness, depression, and sorrow. That's why we celebrate Easter with the greatest joy.

In order to keep this Lenten Season meaningful, we have several services and plans as follows;

On April 6th (Sun), Rev. David Abbott will come and preach about Mary breaking the Alabaster Jar. He will give us a seminar titled "Estate Planning for All Ages" after worship.

April 13th (Sun) will be Palm Sunday, when we will welcome Jesus, waving Palm branches.


On April 17 (Thur), we will have the Maundy Thursday Service at 5 pm. We will remember Jesus' last supper, reading the scripture with the candlelight, and having the Holy Communion. Also, we will offer our Lenten Box to the altar with a prayerful heart.

April 20th (Sun) is Easter Sunday. We will have the Sunrise Service at the Old Cemetery at 6 am, Breakfast at church at 7 am, and Easter Service at 10 am. At the end of the service, children will give you a special Easter gift and a flower. We will go out, march to the cross prepared outside, and decorate the cross with the flowers you receive. There, we will take a group picture as we did last year.

Easter is only four weeks away. Let's make this season of Lent as meaningful as possible by focusing on Jesus' love and sacrifice and finding ways to love God and our neighbors. I hope to see you all in these upcoming meaningful services.

From the Deacons' Bench

I enjoy the anticipation of acquiring nice things. In fact, I'm not all that thrilled to be living in the age where vans or even drones race your product to your door the day you order it. I feel nostalgic thinking about when "Estimated Delivery: 3 weeks" was commonplace: I remember rushing to the mailbox every day after school for over a month to see if a book from a foreign vendor had finally arrived, curious as much to crack open the book itself as to examine the exotic postage stamps on the crinkled brown paper wrapping which had passed many hands in many countries. I would regularly think excitedly about that book during my morning shower, as I fell asleep at night, and probably a few times in between each day until finally it was mine.

Lent is also a period of anticipation, in which we reflect on Christ's final days in the leadup to our celebration of his resurrection on Easter. But there's something very challenging about the Lenten season. For me, it poses two serious questions. The first is: What should I be anticipating? Am I anticipating when it's over and done with so I can go back to drinking coke and eating sumptuous dark chocolate bars? Or am I anticipating a spiritual transformation where these ephemeral little personal pleasures aren't so central to my life anyway? Maybe I'm anticipating a time when our community and our world are more faithful, more giving, and more caring. Maybe I'm hazy about what the future holds, but I anticipate when God in His wisdom will guide me to the path of peace which transcends all understanding.

The second question is: Can I find joy in the anticipation? Can I stand strong in my faith in a world which has in many ways not fundamentally changed since the time in which Jesus was rejected and crucified? We still see and experience illness, poverty, pettiness, corruption, and idolization of people and things which don't love us or do anything positive for us. But if I can find joy in the anticipation of something like that book I was so excited for—which, by the way, turned out like so many worldly things we put our hopes in to be a major disappointment that I wouldn't recommend to anybody—then surely I can find joy in the

anticipation of the promised triumph of the prince of peace. Where we see hints of God's kingdom, glimmers of opportunity to connect and to love, we must chase after those things with worshipful gratitude. And, at least at times, we will find joy in that chase.

These are the questions I'm praying on as Lent turns to Easter. I'm deeply thankful to be part of a congregation in which we strive to support one another along our paths of spiritual growth, and eager for all the opportunities we'll have to connect in the exciting church events or quiet weekday get-togethers of the coming weeks and months. I pray the Lord continues to guide our aspirations, renew our hopes, and deliver us joy which we can spread among and outside our community.

I've moved five times in the last seven years. Two of those times I had to start over with only the bare essentials, bringing with me only what I could fit into a rolling luggage case. We take the little hoard of household items we use in our day-to-day lives for granted, but when you have to go out and acquire them all for yourself, it's actually quite an exhausting process and a pretty hefty expense. And it's definitely no fun getting half-way through making boxed mac & cheese only to realize you don't own a strainer.

For the people served by the Springfield Rescue Mission, these are often additional burdens under the already trying circumstances of being transferred to a new home after living on the streets, recovering from drug addiction, learning to manage debilitating mental health issues, or landing in a new country with few local connections or resources. Your donations have surely been a blessing for those going through such difficult times, easing their stress and demonstrating that someone out there in the world is extending Christian goodwill toward those who are struggling.

Volunteers at the Rescue Mission have repeatedly extended their gratitude to our church congregation for its generosity. And it's been a joy to see how enthusiastically so many people have marched into Libby Hall lugging a waffle-maker or a cast-iron frying pan under their arms. While this particular mission formally ends for our church on March 31st, the Springfield Rescue Mission collects household items for those in need year-round, and all are welcome to drop off household donations on the Libby Hall donation table beyond the end-date of this mission if they would like.

For the months of April and May, our church mission will be to support Shriners Hospitals for Children. Announcements with further details are forthcoming.
